This program offers comprehensive presentations in the trauma care continuum, examining diverse subjects from evidence based practice and innovative advances in the care of injured patients.

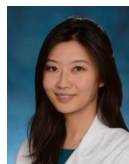

Fan Liang, M.D.

Fan Liang, M.D. is a facial plastic and reconstructive surgeon who specializes in complex adult craniofacial trauma, reconstruction of secondary craniofacial deformities, pediatric craniofacial surgery and microsurgery at R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma. She completed her undergraduate education at Princeton University and went on to obtain her medical degree at Harvard Medical School. She then completed her residency in Plastic Surgery at the University of Southern California, followed by a fellowship in Pediatric and Craniofacial Plastic Surgery at University of Michigan. She has been recognized by the American Society of Plastic Surgeons and the American Association of Plastic Surgeons for her research in recombinant human bone morphogenetic protein-2 (rhBMP-2) and has served as the national resident representative to the American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons from 2015-2017.



Arthur Jung Nam, M.D., M.S.

Arthur Jung Nam, M.D., M.S. is a nationally and internationally renowned plastic surgeon and assistant professor of plastic and reconstructive surgery at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center/ University of Maryland School of Medicine. He completed his medical degree at Jefferson Medical College, general surgery residency at George Washington University Medical Center, and a research fellowship in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center. He also completed a combined plastic surgery fellowship at The Johns Hopkins Hospital and University of Maryland Medical Center. He is double board certified in general surgery and plastic surgery and is an active member of the American Society of Plastic Surgeons and the American Society of Transplant Surgeons. His areas of research are in complex adult craniofacial trauma, reconstruction of secondary craniofacial deformities, and clinical outcomes following reconstruction. His expertise include using microsurgical techniques to reconstruct soft tissue defects of head and neck, chest, abdominal wall and lower extremities following traumatic injury or oncologic surgery.



Alvaro Cabezas, M.D.

Alvaro Cabezas, M.D. brings his experience from one of New Jersey's busiest referral institutions, where he was trained in the latest techniques and advancements in orthopedic surgery. He is a graduate of the



University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, where he also recently completed his residency. A veteran of the U.S. Army, Dr. Cabezas served under Operation Enduring Freedom while stationed in Fort Gordon, Ga. His time as a combat medic and laboratory technician in the military has helped him refine his ability to work with a variety of individuals. Being fluent in English and Spanish, Dr. Cabezas brings comprehensive care to a wide population of patients. He is a member of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons.

Scott Hultman M.D., M.B.A., FACS

Scott Hultman M.D., M.B.A., FACS is the director of the Johns Hopkins Burn Center, Department of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. Dr. Hultman's specialties include burn treatment and reconstruction, microsurgical reconstruction, aesthetic surgery and surgery of the hand. As the Burn Center director, he oversees the clinical operations of the adult burn unit at Johns Hopkins Bayview and was responsible for developing a burn reconstruction program for adults and children. He also serves as the vice chair of strategic development for the department. Dr. Hultman formerly practiced at the University of North Carolina Hospitals where he served as the chief emeritus of the Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the Ethel and James Valone distinguished professor of surgery, and founder/director of the Aesthetic, Laser, and Burn Reconstruction Center, an office-based surgery facility. Dr. Hultman is the former chair of the Graduate Medical Education Committee at UNC and established their six-year, integrated residency program in plastic surgery. He is also the vice president of academic affairs and reconstructive surgery for the American Society of Plastic Surgeons and the Plastic Surgery Foundation and a member of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education Residency Review Committee for Plastic Surgery.



Jennifer Knight, M.D.

Jennifer Knight, M.D. is an Associate professor, Department of Surgery and Associate Trauma Director of the Jon Michael Moore Trauma Center, West Virginia University School of Medicine. Dr. Knight received her Medical Degree from West Virginia University with a Surgical Critical Care Fellowship at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center, University of Maryland. Dr. Knight's interests include acute care surgery which includes trauma surgery, surgical critical care, emergency general surgery and elective general surgery. She also is the only provider at WVU who places diaphragmatic pacemakers for diaphragm paralysis and operative fixations of rib fractures.
