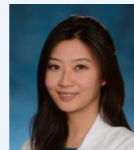
Carrie Cox, RN, M.S.N. is the Outreach and Education Coordinator for Johns Hopkins Burn Center at Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center in Baltimore, Maryland. She has worked for the Burn Center for the past 23 years as a Burn ICU nurse and has been in her current role for 17 years. She is responsible for the development, coordination, and delivery of various clinical educational programs on and off-site related to burn care and burn referral for healthcare professionals throughout the region including EMS, nursing, mid-level providers, and physicians. She also trains United States Military healthcare personnel in preparation for deployment to various locations around the world, and works closely with the Johns Hopkins University Center for Law Enforcement Medicine, Division of Special Operations providing education for the United States Marshal Service and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives. As part of her role, Carrie is also responsible for burn prevention programs for the community and various outreach events statewide. Finally, Carrie has also been the Clinical Research Nurse/Coordinator for the Burn Center for the past 8 years where she works closely with the entire multi-disciplinary burn center team in developing, coordinating, and leading multiple research projects. She has experience in both industry sponsored clinical trials, as well as investigator initiated research of all types.



Jennifer Knight, MD joined the faculty of the Department of Surgery in 2009 and is currently Associate Professor at the West Virginia University School of Medicine, Department of Surgery. She is an active member of the Division of Trauma, Acute Care Surgery and Surgical Critical Care. As the Director of the Jon Michael Moore Trauma Center, under her leadership, the center maintains verification as an American College of Surgeons' (ACS) Level One Trauma Center. Dr. Knight Davis completed medical school and general surgery residency at West Virginia University. She completed a Surgical Critical Care fellowship at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center

at the University of Maryland and is double boarded in General Surgery and Surgical Critical Care. Dr. Knights received a grant for the Claude W. Benedum Foundation to "Improve Outcomes of the Rural Trauma Patient" using smart phone technology. Her clinical areas of interest are rib plating and fixation, and diaphragmatic pace making in spinal cord injury and ALS.

Dr. Knight Davis served as a Faculty Senator for the University. She is a course coordinator for Advance Trauma Life Support and an instructor of the Rural Trauma Team Development Course. She serves of the Advisory Council for the Center of Organ Recovery and Education. She services as a Program Committee member for the ACS Point Counterpoint Acute Care Surgery Conference. She has received multiple awards including the Chancellor's Awards for Outstanding Achievement – Chancellor's Award for Team Achievement, the Excellence in Medical Student Teaching Award for the Department of Surgery, WV Alpha Chapter of Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society member, the Jon Michael Moore Trauma Center Night of Recognition Cornerstone Award for 4 years, the Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma (EAST) Mentoring Program, and WVU Healthcare Quality Award.



Fan Liang, M.D. is a facial plastic and reconstructive surgeon who specializes in complex adult craniofacial trauma, reconstruction of secondary craniofacial deformities, pediatric craniofacial surgery, and microsurgery at R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma. She completed her undergraduate education at Princeton University and went on to obtain her medical degree at Harvard Medical School. She then completed her residency in Plastic Surgery at the University of Southern California, followed by a fellowship in Pediatric and Craniofacial Plastic Surgery at University of Michigan. She has been recognized by the American Society of Plastic Surgeons and the American Association of Plastic Surgeons for her research in recombinant human bone morphogenetic protein-2 (rhBMP-2) and has served as the national resident representative to the American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons from 2015-2017.



Ellen Plummer, DL, MBA, MSN, RN CCRN has 25 years of working in the Trauma Resuscitation Unit at R. Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center. She functions in the roles of Senior Clinical Nurse II and Charge Nurse within the unit. She graduated with her Doctor of Laws in Healthcare Law from Widener University School of Law. She worked as a consultant for medical negligence in elder care for several years. She graduated with a MSN/MBA dual degree from Wilmington University. She did work as a contracted Nurse Investigator for the Maryland Department of Health and Human Services. She has her CCRN (Certified Critical Care) and has been an Advance Trauma Course for Nurses instructor for 18 years. She has been published in several journals with most of the content being discussion of care for trauma in the elderly. She has been an active member of the American Association of Critical Care Nurses since 1983.



Susan Ziegfeld M.S.N, PNP-BC has been a pediatric nurse for 35 years. She received her BSN at Holy Family College in Philadelphia in 1986 and practiced as a PICU nurse at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for 12 years. She obtained her MSN from the University of Pennsylvania in 1997. She worked as a Pediatric Oncology Nurse Practitioner for 3 years in South Carolina before accepting a position Nurse Practitioner at The Johns Hopkins Children's Center. She is currently a Lead Nurse Practitioner and Manager of the pediatric trauma and burn programs. Susan has many publications on pediatric trauma and burn related topics. She is very involved and has presented in national organizations on a variety of pediatric trauma and burn topics.
